

# Coastal Walk – 4½ miles

## Stonebarrow Hill, Dorset

There are over 25 miles of paths to explore on the Golden Cap Estate, this particular walk starts at Stonebarrow Hill car park.

### Getting there:

**Road:** Off A35 between Lyme Regis and Bridport

**Bus:** First/Jurassic Coast Bus X53

**Cycle:** NCN2

**Maps and start grid ref:** OS Sheet 193, SY383933

**Facilities available:** parking, toilets, shop, and information centre

**Terrain:** Difficult in places, steep slopes

**Distance:** 4.5 miles, allow 3.5 hours to complete

**Accessibility:** Undulating landscape with grassy tracks and cliff edge paths. Stay away from the edge and take special care when it has been raining or when the ground is wet as it can be very slippery. Children should be supervised at all times

**Points of interest:** From the car park, looking seaward, turn left and start by walking along the ridge track, looking out for the following features

1. Start
  2. Medieval hamlet of Stanton St Gabriel
  3. Ruins of the chapel of St Gabriel
  4. Filcombe Wood with its twisted trees
  5. Golden Cap, the highest point on the south coast, some 188 metres
  6. Patchworks of hedges, a traditional feature of the landscape
- Return via West Hay Farm to the car park
